

## BURLINGTON CITY COUNCIL REGULAR SESSION SEPTEMBER 2, 2015

City of Burlington Governing Body met in Regular Session at City Hall, 301 Neosho Street, Burlington, Kansas at 6:00 p.m. Wednesday, September 2, 2015. Mayor Stan Luke called the meeting to order.

**AGENDA:** *Council Member Griffith stated, "I move to approve the amended agenda." Council Member Tschantz, "Second." Motion unanimously carried.*

**MINUTES: August 19, 2015:** *Council Member Curtiss, "I move to accept the Draft Minutes of Council's regular session of August 19, 2015 as presented." Council Member Griffith, "Second it." Motion unanimously carried.*

**APPOINTMENT: Janine Wagner/Camrie Wagner, Creepy Crawl on October 3, 2015**

Janine Wagner stated, "This is my daughter, Camrie. She's in the Sophomore class at the Burlington High School this year. We just want to ask for your approval and acceptance to do the Creepy Crawl Fun Run. It's been done in the past. Sally Stewart has done it for Madison's class several years in a row; and I did it with my older daughter for a couple of years. We missed last year because we had some other projects going on, but we're wanting to bring it back this year. It will be on the same day as the Taste of Fall Festival, and on the same route we've always used - just down 3rd Street and back up around the back of the rodeo grounds and then back up here to City Hall. We ask that you consider that request. It is on October 3rd."

*Council Member Curtiss stated, "I move to approve the request for the Burlington High School Sophomore Class to hold the Creepy Crawl in conjunction with the Taste of Fall Festival on October 3rd, 2015." Council Member Lenard, "Second." Mayor Luke called for discussion. Council Member Curtiss asked if the Department Heads had any objections. They did not. Hearing no further comments or questions, Mayor Luke called for a vote. Motion unanimously carried.*

**PUBLIC COMMENTS:** None

**ELECTRIC DEPARTMENT: Distribution Updates**

**General:** Superintendent Schneider reported, "We are still doing our daily work orders, locates, and customer service requests. We did some tree trimming since last council, but were really busy adding customer services."

**KDOT Project at 4th & Neosho - conduit cut:** Superintendent Schneider stated, "We did spend a considerable amount of time at 4th and Neosho. The contractor working at the intersection started by cutting through the conduit that houses the communications cables operating the stoplights in the intersection. They actually had to tear out some of the new pour they did so we could get to it to do the repair. The conduit repairs are complete, and the communication cables are scheduled to be replaced soon. We have a traffic signal company coming from Missouri that will replace those communications cables. We did have one of the overhead westbound lights torn down by a trackhoe pulling up concrete." He added, "We're keeping track of all those expenses, and the State will withhold payment from the contractor until we get reimbursed for that. That was a good repair." Council Member Scothorn inquired, "Do they know how to call dig safe?" Superintendent Schneider replied, "They did - it was marked perfectly, and they went right through the red line."

**ELECTRIC DEPARTMENT: Power Plant/Production Update**

**General:** Personnel are still doing required reports.

**Generator #5 Repairs:** Superintendent Schneider reported, "Some scheduled maintenance was done again on Generator #5. The governor on it was old and was malfunctioning. We had a replacement onsite, so the men did the replacement. It actually not only improved the running of the generator, our total kw output also improved."

**WATER DEPARTMENT: Distribution Update**

**Waterline Replacement Project - Niagara Street (4th to 10th) and Fire Hydrant flushing:** Superintendent Hawkins reported, "We are back to putting more services in on Niagara Street, but we've not gotten a lot done because we've been trying to go through the entire town with flushing fire hydrants. We had citizens concerned about the red water; so we went back and flushed in their areas again because when we flush hydrants, it disturbs the(rust/sediment in the line. We apologize for the inconvenience. I have asked Jimmy (Zoning Clerk Hugunin) to put something on Facebook to keep the public informed, even though we are verbally saying this in council, just to give them a heads up. We're about done and in between regular duties, repairing water leaks, etcetera, we will still be flushing fire hydrants."

**Backflow Preventers/Rural Water Meters-compliance:** Superintendent Hawkins stated, "We did have Gary Armatrout (Kansas Department of Agriculture) come in. He checked all of our backflow preventers. He came in and checked calibrations on our meters for the Water Plant effluent and influent. Everything is in compliance with the State; so he got those recorded."

**Two-inch Meter System Calibration:** Superintendent Hawkins said, "We've asked Gary Armatrout to come in and go through our two-inch meter systems as well because we want to make sure they are staying within calibration."

**Water Leaks:** Personnel have been repairing a few minor water leaks. The one today was a small line break at 12th and Alleghany.

**Gridley's Water Meter:** Superintendent Hawkins reported, "Tomorrow, we are going to work on installing Gridley's water meter, so we are orchestrating with Brian Isch at the City of Gridley. We will have them down and have all the parts ready to put the brand new meter in the ground tomorrow."

**General:** Personnel have been doing normal duties: doing work orders, line locates, etc.

**WATER DEPARTMENT: Water Production Update**

**Water Treatment Plant - Clean up:** Superintendent Hawkins reported personnel finished cleaning up the front of the Water Treatment Plant. The two rapid mixers, the reactors, and the two clarifiers are done.

**Stainless Steel Tank - Valve issues:** Superintendent Hawkins reported, "We're having some issues with our valves in our stainless steel tanks and are still working with them. I asked Tom Miller, Millers Engineering, to come down. He did come down and helped me rebuild and refurbish one valve, but it's still going to need some replacements. We're working with De Zurich to come in and get parts and pieces so we can stay on top of that. We don't want any valves to completely fail."

**Work Schedule:** The Water/Wastewater Department has returned to their normal eight-hour work days.

**STREET DEPARTMENT: Update**

Superintendent Mast is in Phoenix, Arizona this week for the American Public Works Association (APWA) International Public Works Conference. Personnel have been trimming trees, working on the waterline replacement project, and doing regular duties.

**POLICE DEPARTMENT: Update**

**KDOT Highway 75 Resurfacing Project - Ad Astra Wind Farm Traffic:** Chief Doug Jones reported that it has been normal calls for the Police Department other than the supersize loads going through town to the Wind Farm project in the Waverly area. He said, "They started Monday and we've had two of the big Nacelle units come through, and now we've had three of the propeller hubs. Without the asphalt paving going on, it's just the construction at the intersection of Neosho and Highway 75. Other than the first time going through when they hit one of the shrouds going around the streetlight, it has actually gone fairly well. Two down and 93 to go." (*Note: Loads, including transport vehicles, would be as large as 209' long, 16' 7" high, 15' wide, and with a gross weight of 417,000 pounds. Two per day through December are expected to travel through Burlington on Highway 75. Transport vehicles include the one carrying the load and one pushing that vehicle.*)

**POLICE DEPARTMENT: Nuisance Properties**

**Nuisance Update- 928 Des Moines:** Chief Jones reported, "The structure demolition project at 928 Des Moines is done, completely cleared out."

**Nuisance Update - 718 S. 5th:** Chief Jones reported, "Talking with Danny (Water Superintendent), the plumber has the lines either capped off or diverted; and 718 S. 5th Street is ready for demolition to begin." The Notice to Proceed that was mailed to Skillman Construction on August 18th included both 928 DesMoines and 718 S. 5th Street demolitions, with the contingency that Skillman Construction and Chief Jones would agree on the schedule for the demolitions, so Chief Jones will contact Mike Skillman.

**Other Nuisance Properties:** Chief Jones reported, "We have been making contacts concerning other nuisance properties around town. We have generally had very positive contacts and have actually already had some progress on some of the properties. It will be an on-going process for some of these."

**POLICE DEPARTMENT: Vehicle Purchase (2014 Dodge Charger)**

Chief Jones stated, "We got ahold of the Kansas Highway Patrol and got their list of what they have in stock now and what they anticipate to be coming in. The Police Committee pointed out to me that for another \$850, we can get a 2014 model year vehicle. So, that is actually what I am going to recommend - that we purchase a used 2014 Dodge Charger from Kansas Highway Patrol, with sirens and lights still installed, for a total price of \$18,850."

Council Member Lenard stated, "I think we had previously approved that. We just wanted to make sure where the funds were. I think we're probably good on this purchase with the financing." Chief Jones said, "I've been working with Gina (City Clerk) on this." City Clerk Kewley indicated a motion would be needed. (continued)

Council Member Lenard stated, "I move to authorize Chief Jones to proceed with the purchase of the used 2014 Dodge Charger from the Kansas Highway Patrol, with the price not to exceed \$18,850." Council Member Tschantz stated, "I'll second that." Hearing no discussion on the motion, Mayor Luke called for a vote. Motion unanimously carried, 6:0.

**POLICE DEPARTMENT: Personnel - Hire Blake Hanson**

Chief Jones stated, "Yesterday, the City Clerk, Officer Szambecki, and I interviewed one of our candidates for the Patrol Officer position. We were impressed with him and thought he did very well on the interview. I am recommending that we extend an offer of employment to Blake Hanson, at a starting salary of \$15.76. This is for a non-certified police officer. He will have to go through training and we will have to send him to the Academy (Kansas Law Enforcement Training Center), but that's not an unexpected detail. He will start in approximately two weeks. He is currently working for the Coffey County Sheriff over at the jail and would like to give notice. He will start approximately the 21st of September, possibly earlier."

Council Member Lenard stated, "I move to extend an offer of employment as Police Officer to Blake Hanson, at the hourly wage of \$15.76, with a start date of approximately September 21, 2015." Council Member Hall, "I'll second." Mayor Luke called for discussion. Council Member Lewis asked, "What's the plan for getting him to the Academy?" Chief Jones explained, "That will depend on the Academy's schedule. State law requires that we send him within one year of employment. The Academy's schedule and how full their classes are will determine which class he gets in. Once we send the paperwork, they will let us know when he will be scheduled." Hearing no additional discussion, Mayor Luke called for a vote. Motion unanimously carried, 6:0.

**PARKS DEPARTMENT: Update**

**General:** Superintendent Boyce reported, "We have been doing normal duties: cleaning public buildings and restrooms, mowing, weed eating, spraying weeds, and watering flowers and trees. We put up the fall banners in anticipation of KDOT switching traffic to the west side of Highway 75. We also removed broken limbs from trees in the rights-of-way."

**Nuisance Properties Mowed:** Parks personnel mowed two nuisance properties.

**Police Department Building:** Parks personnel buried the sump pump line at the Police Department, anticipating dirtwork for grass seeding.

**Fencing Projects:** Superintendent Boyce the fence at the Parks Department is complete and looks 100% better. He is anticipating that Midland Fence will start on the fencing at the Dog Park next week.

**CLAIMS 2015-17:** Council Member Lenard, "I move City of Burlington pay Claims Ordinance 2015-17 in the amount of \$62,416.26 for payment of city bills." Council Member Scothorn, "Second." Mayor Luke called for discussion. City Clerk Kewley stated, "You can see by the amount of the ordinance, it's pretty low. Kan-Com is \$4,122.42; Kritz-Davis is \$3,539.32; Trenary Tree Care is \$4,425.00. Hearing no further discussion, Mayor Luke instructed City Clerk Kewley to poll Council for a vote. All votes were in favor. Mayor Luke declared Claims Ordinance 2015-17 approved by unanimous vote, 6:0.

**PAYROLL 2015-18:** Council Member Lenard stated, "I move City of Burlington pay Payroll Ordinance 2015-18 in the amount of \$73,315.10." Council Member Griffith, "Second." Hearing no discussion, Mayor Luke instructed City Clerk Kewley to poll Council for a vote. All votes were in favor. Mayor Luke declared Payroll Ordinance 2015-18 approved by unanimous vote, 6:0.

**FINANCE: Utility Billing - Extend due dates through September 14th at 8 a.m.**

City Clerk Kewley stated, "I want to give you an update on what is going on. Most of you probably got your utility bills in the mail today. Computer Information Concepts (CIC) was on site all last week. Steve Reed and Joanie are here today, and are here working right now. We did not have a correct conversion. We have a lot of variables that go into our utility billing. We went ahead and mailed out the bills with errors. Steve Reed is recommending that we correct the errors, run a new conversion, waive the penalty for the month of September 10th billing due date and put a note on the bills that the penalty will be waived. We need to get the information out to our customers, so we will rerun the bills, put them all in envelopes with a note of explanation and asking them to please disregard the bill they received first and to pay this new bill; and telling them that if they did pay the first bill, any payment made will be reflected on the next month's bill."

Dear Customer:

As you may be aware, we are converting to a new financial software program. As with most conversions, there are some issues to be worked out, and so the utility bill you received earlier this week has errors.

Our contractor, Computer Information Concepts, has been working to correct the problems, and the bill dated September 1st is enclosed. If you have already paid or want to pay the amount shown on the first bill, any payments will appear on next month's billing statement.

Please disregard any penalties shown on the bill. At last evenings council meeting, the Governing Body waived penalties for utility bills due September 10, 2015.

Customers on the Level Payment Plan are asked to pay their normal level pay amount, which is shown on the left side of the bill.

Also, the old code PC (Power Cost Adjustment) and the new code FA (Fuel Adjustment) are the same. RE is now ELRE (Electric Residential); and WA is now WARE (Water Residential).

We apologize for the confusion and thank you for your patience.

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City Clerk Kewley, "One thing you've got to understand is that it is a huge software program. We're dealing with demand meters, unit charges, taxes, power cost credits that we have to convert, the AMI project, Bosen handheld readings, finals level pay accounts, . There are multiple modules to the software. It's going to take some time, but we are making progress and will get the conversion completed. I apologize for the confusion.

Council Member Griffith asked, "What happened, Gina? Did you have some crazy bills?" City Clerk Kewley replied, "No, it's the software conversion. They got copies of our files and for some reason they're not getting transferred over (converted) correctly. Now that we're giving a power cost credit, their program wasn't converting it to their program to credit the tax back." She added, "We have been very busy working with CIC and the public this week. When CIC was here last time, they said everything would be ready and would be good, but evidently when they went to run, they were not ready. We needed to get the bills out, and were told to just get them out and we'd make adjustments later. Well, now we've got to fix these things and run new bills."

Council Member Lenard asked, "So, is there anything in that agreement with performance guarantee if we have issues like this?" City Clerk Kewley said, "They are going to reimburse us for postage we use, all their training while they're here, and make it right. It is time consuming working through things. Actually, when I came in yesterday morning (after a week's vacation), the girls were pretty upset, and I got on the phone with Steve Reed. Steve is actually the person who wrote the Reeds Software program we used for several years. Then it was Infinitec, Manitron, and Thompson Reuters. Now, Steve Reed is working with CIC, and is here onsite trying to get it right."

**Mayor Luke asked, "What's the Council's pleasure in respect with waiving the penalties for the utility billing due September 10th?" Council Member Hall stated, "I move to waive the penalties for the utility billing due September 10, 2015." Council Member Curtiss, "Second it." Hearing no discussion, Mayor Luke called for a vote. Motion unanimously carried, 6:0.**

**PLANNING & ZONING: Update**

**General:** Zoning Clerk Hugunin has been updating Facebook and the webpage; and updated the permits and sent them to the County Appraiser's office. He has also been working with Administrative Assistant Stroh preparing the City Code to be sent to the League of Kansas Municipalities for recodification. He is working with the Parks Superintendent to get his printer working compatibly with his computer.

**Fall Cleanup:** Zoning Clerk Hugunin reported he was notified today that Coffey County is offering their biannual free dumping at the Landfill during the week of October 12th. He has prepared the flyers for Burlington's 2015 City-wide Cleanup. Brush should be placed curbside prior to 7 a.m. on Monday, October 5th, and trash/junk should be curbside prior to 7 a.m. on Monday, October 12th. Flyers are available at City Hall, at burlingtonkansas.gov, on the city's Facebook page, and will be published in the Coffey County Republican.

**City Hall Computer Update:** Zoning Clerk Hugunin is still working on updating the memory on City Hall's computers because with the new financial programs through Computer Information Concepts, we need more RAM (Random Access Memory). He said, "It took a while to find a good inexpensive source for the memory, and ironically DELL was the cheapest source."

**OTHER BUSINESS: LKM Voting Delegate and Alternate Appointments**

Mayor Luke stated, "We need to elect a Voting Delegate and an Alternate for the League of Kansas Municipalities Conference. Who from the Council plans on attending?" City Clerk Kewley said, "So far, I've got Jerilyn and Stan." Council Member Lenard said, "I plan on going, but I need to check the volleyball schedule first. It should be done by then." City Clerk Kewley told him to be sure to let her know by September 25th."

**Voting Delegate:** Council Member Lenard stated, "I nominate Jerilyn Curtiss as City of Burlington's Voting Delegate to the League of Kansas Municipalities Conference." Council Member Griffith, "I'll second." Mayor Luke asked, "Any discussion, Jerilyn?" Council Member Curtiss stated, "Jerilyn served her time." Mayor Luke, "Well, you didn't last year." Council Member Curtiss said, "I know, but I was roped into all those other years. That's okay, I'll do it." **Hearing no further discussion, Mayor Luke called for a vote.** Council Member Curtiss abstained. **Motion carried with a majority vote, 5:0.**

**Alternate Delegate:** Council Member Lenard stated, "I nominate Stan Luke as City of Burlington's Alternate Voting Delegate to the League of Kansas Municipalities Conference." Council Member Scothorn, "I'll second." **Hearing no discussion, Mayor Luke called for a vote. Motion carried by unanimous vote, 6:0.**

**PERMITS: Permits issued by Zoning Clerk Hugunin:** None

**ORDINANCE 839, Madison Telephone Franchise Contract**

Mayor Luke read the complete title of proposed Ordinances 839, a Contract Franchise Ordinance granted to Madison Telephone LLC, doing business as MT Networks LLC, a telecommunications local exchange service within City Of Burlington, Kansas. This Ordinance replaces Ordinance 827. He said, "Basically, we're replacing Ordinance 827, plus we're changing what is classified as Access Line." City Clerk Kewley explained the changes included updating the definition of an Access Line; adding definitions for Electronic Communication, Wire Communication, and Wireless Communication; and alphabetized the definitions. Section 3. Rights Assigned' was added; and the \$2 per access line was changed to 3% of retail sales. City Attorney Robrahn had reviewed the proposed ordinance.

**Council Member Lenard stated, "I move to adopt Ordinance 839, to enter into the contract franchise with Madison Telephone LLC, granting service within the City of Burlington, Kansas." Council Member Scothorn gave the second. Hearing no discussion, Mayor Luke directed City Clerk Kewley to poll Council for a vote. All votes were in favor. Mayor Luke declared Ordinance 839 adopted by a unanimous vote of 6:0.**

**LEGAL DEPARTMENT: Update**

City Attorney Robrahn stated, "The last couple of weeks I've been fielding questions from Department Heads on various legal issues and questions; and we have been working our way through that."

**CITY CLERK: Update**

**General:** City Clerk Kewley stated, "Like I said earlier, City Hall Staff has been working on the utility billing. They have also been preparing vouchers for bill paying, preparing payroll, fielding calls, and preparing minutes for the council meeting."

**Police Officer Interview:** City Clerk Kewley participated in the interview for the police officer yesterday.

**2015 Annual League Conference:** City Clerk Kewley reminded everyone the 2015 Annual League Conference will be in Topeka on October 10 through 12; and that registration deadline is the 25th of September.

**2015 Kansas Power Pool Fall Planning Retreat:** City Clerk Kewley also reminded everyone the KPP 2015 Fall Planning Retreat is on September 11th and 12th at the Legends in Kansas City. The deadline for registering is tomorrow, September 3rd.

**Labor Day Closing:** City of Burlington will be closed Monday, September 7th in observance of Labor Day.

**Utility Bills - Reprint:** Council Member Curtiss asked when the new bills are expected to be mailed. City Clerk Kewley replied, "Before the meeting tonight, Steve Reed was hoping to print bills tomorrow. They are trying to get a good conversion tonight, and we're looking at potentially sending out bills tomorrow." She added, "Also, the Postmaster was in here today going over some issues with our billing cards. It takes two to three days for the cards to go out after we take them to the Post Office. Mail now goes to Kansas City and back; so we will probably need to consider getting bills out a couple days earlier than we have. KPP is usually good about getting their bill to us; but we have to wait on our bills from Seminole which in 2015 became Continuum Retail Energy, and Atmos Energy so we can prepare our bills. We have two to three days at the end of the month to get everything prepared to send bills out."

Attorney Robrahn asked if it was preferred for customers to wait until they get the corrected bill rather than send the payment in based on the first and incorrect bill. City Clerk Kewley said, "Yes, and we are going to put notices in the new bill to please disregard the first one, but if they did pay the first one, the difference will be credited to the next month's bill."
