## CITY OF BURLINGTON

### ELECTRIC RATE INCREASE

#### EFFECTIVE WITH UTILITY BILL DUE SEPTEMBER 10, 2014

On June 18, 2014, Burlington's Governing Body, after opening the meeting for public discussion, unanimously adopted Ordinance 830, providing for and fixing the rate schedule to be charged for electricity. The rate increase will be seen on the utility bill that will be due on September 10, 2014.

A recent Electric Rate Study, by Allgeier Martin & Associates determined that for City of Burlington to continue to provide adequate electricity to our consumers, we had no choice but to increase electric utility rates.

Contributing factors to our need to increase rates are: 1) rising energy costs from our energy provider; 2) the Environmental Protection Agency's forced emission rules for the Electric Power Plant, and 3) increased costs to maintain our Power Plant and distribution system.

City of Burlington wants to keep customers informed and prepared for the proposed rate increase that after approval will go into effect on the August 15, 2014 utility billing.

We are proud to serve and it is our goal to provide reliable electric service to our customers.
